



## Schedule a SCHA Site Visit

A site visit is an opportunity for one of our team members from the South Carolina Hospital Association or the Harvard School of Public Health to come to your hospital and observe the use of the checklist in your operating rooms. Our team has visited more than 50 hospitals and ambulatory surgery centers across South Carolina and has seen the checklist used in hundreds of cases.

What are the benefits of scheduling a site visit?

- This is an opportunity for the Safe Surgery 2015 team and the SCHA to learn from what you are doing in your hospital to help us further shape the Safe Surgery 2015 program.
- We also have the opportunity to share ideas and lessons learned from other site visits that you may be able to incorporate into your program.
- A site visit provides an outside perspective of how teams are using the checklist in your operating rooms.

What happens during a site visit?

- We will work with you to schedule a convenient time to observe cases in your ORs where the surgical checklist is being used. Some key components include:
  - Observation of checklist discussions during cases in the OR,
  - Debriefing with the checklist implementation team,
  - Feedback on OR observations, and
  - Identification of implementation strengths and weaknesses as well as a discussion on how to best overcome barriers so the checklist can be used in a meaningful way.
